

Everence HSA Limited Power of Attorney



Regulations require that only one individual may own an HSA. Because of this, you may want your spouse to have the ability to write checks or be issued a debit card. In order to do this, you must designate that individual as limited power of attorney on your HSA.

I, _____, hereby appoint my spouse, named below and whose signature appears below, to be my true and lawful attorney, for me and in my name to ask, demand, and receive from Everence from time to time and at any and all times, any or all monies standing to my credit in my Everence health savings account number _____, and upon receipt thereof, or any part thereof, to execute and deliver to the said credit union good and sufficient receipts or acquitances for the same; and further to endorse checks payable to me or to my order and to receive from the credit union all or any part of the proceeds thereof in cash or otherwise.

It is understood and agreed that this power shall stand irrevoked and in full force and effect until I shall give, and the said credit union shall have received, written notice of the termination hereof, and shall not be terminated by my disability or incompetence.
